2019 SPRING GRANT CYCLE

The deadline for both the Smart & Caring Grant as well as the Community Impact Award was March 15th. We saw a total of 33 applications submitted. 19 of those were for the Smart & Caring Grant and 14 of them were Letters of Intent for the Community Impact Award. The total funds requested was over \$600,000. Members of our Grants and Community Leadership committees are currently reviewing these applications closely.

The grant funding recommendations will be ratified at our Board of Directors meeting on May 16th and all grants will be presented at our Founder's Day Picnic on May 31st.

Each year we are noticing that the needs in our community are not only increasing, the requests for funding are significantly rising as well. It is only because of our valued donors that we are able to fund a portion of these needs.



Donor Profile: Craig Elder

Craig Elder and his family moved to Medicine Hat from Calgary in 2004. They found it to be an instantly welcoming place to be a part of a community. Craig has been involved with Rotary since 1998 and continues to do so as part of the Medicine Hat Sunrise Rotary Club.

Since arriving in 2004, Craig has been an engaged community member by sitting on the boards of the CCDA, the Medicine Hat PC Association, Medicine Hat Rugby Development Association, Medicine Hat Burns Club and the Cypress Club. He has also been part of the Medicine Hat College Business Advisory Committee, the Invest Medicine Hat advisory committee and the Women's Shelter Endowment committee.

"I was raised with the belief that the community in which you live and work contributes to your success and growth as a member of that community. Therefore, it is mutually beneficial to nurture, contribute and give back to the community that gives so much to you." says Craig.

Recognizing how much the community has given to Craig and his family, they decided to establish the Elder Family Fund in 2009. The distributions from the Elder Family Fund are designated to our community's greatest needs through Smart and Caring granting process.

"My belief in giving to the Community Foundation is that since it is an endowment, that once you give, your gift isn't just a one-time benefit to the community. It is a gift that keeps on giving year after year. As someone who works in the financial industry, an important part of what I do is creating a return on investment. KidSport received a Smart and Caring Grant of \$15,000 in November 2017.


