## \$35,000 in Forty Mile Fall 2019

6 CHARITIES AND NON-PROFIT GROUPS SUPPORTED

In November 2019 our Fall Grant Reception was held and \$35,000 in grants were provided to six different non-profit and charitable groups in our region.

Our Fall 2019 Smart & Caring grants were awarded to the Bow Island Municipal/Susan Andersen Library (\$5,000) to finish their solarium project; the North Forty Mile Recreation Society for the Town of Bow Island Arena Accessibility Project (\$5,000); and the Bow Island Historical & Tourism Society also received a (\$10,000) grant for maintenance of the Bow Theatre.

The region also received an additional \$15,000 in grants through the RBC Future Launch Community Challenge held in partnership with **Community Foundations** Canada. Partnering with youth in the community, Foremost School received a grant of \$5,000 for their youth entrepreneurship program; the Foremost Evangelical-Free Church received \$5,000 for their Re-Create youth program; and the Town of Bow Island - Youth Swim Club also received a grant of \$5,000.

The dollars from these grants are already in place through each of these organizations, benefiting many throughout our County of Forty Mile!

## \$5,000 Grant Received for Spring Repurposed Funds

GRANT TO SUPPORT

YOUTH PROGRAMS

The 2020 year has looked considerably different and presented challenging times for many, as we are sure you would agree.

When our communities were facing uncertainty at the start of the pandemic, the CFSEA Board of Directors quickly pivoted to ensure that the greatest needs throughout Southeastern Alberta would be served.

The Board made a decision to re-purpose the 2020 Spring Smart & Caring grants to address the urgent and immediate needs due to the impacts of COVID19 across the Southeastern Alberta region.

Over a two-month period the grants committee met and recommended funding to 18 charities in Southeast Alberta totaling \$104,030.

The Forty Mile Regional FCSS received a \$5,000 Spring Repurposed Grant during this time for its Summer Fun Program, presented to Youth Workers (bottom left) by local committee members Clint Thacker and Curtis Gouw. It was a program that many youth and families across the region were able to participate in, keeping everyone active throughout the summer months.

Supporting vulnerable populations, such as youth and their families was a primary goal of the Spring Repurposed grants, and our region.

# \$36,711.50 Granted for COVID19 Response in County of Forty Mile

The Stay-At-Home Gala was held in spring to establish a COVID19 Response Fund for SE Alberta, and our County of Forty Mile raised over \$4,000 in sponsorship and donations! To date, there have been five rounds of funding through the COVID19 Response Fund, and many needs in our Forty Mile region have been supported.

### In total, the County of Forty Mile has received \$36,711.50 grants from COVID19 Response Fund for SE Alberta.
