One of the most exciting programs to take place annually is Youth in Philanthropy. It gives CFSEA an amazing opportunity to speak with the youth in our communities and inform them on what philanthropy means and how they can give back.

The students from St. Luke's Outreach took part in this year's YiP Program and allocated \$1,800 across three local charities - Cantara Safehouse, Brooks Animal Protection Society and Brooks & County Victim's Assistance Unit. \$27,416.50 Awarded to 5 local charities in 2021

Our annual Smart & Caring Community Grants for 2021 were awarded in June and November. region in a number of ways.
















A FINAL NOTE...
