2022 Spring Community Grants

The Cypress County Community Fund presented the 2022 Spring Community Grants to three Cypress County organizations at the launch event in May. In total, \$19,000 was granted throughout the region. Congratulations and thank you for all your dedication to our communities!

Dunmore Equestrian Society- \$10,000



Dunmore Equestrian applied for funding for their Heritage Gather that will feature Rodeo competitors and Indigenous ceremonies to celebrate and share western traditions and Indigenous culture. CFSEA awarded them a grant of \$10,000 for this project.

Whispering Pines Fellowship Centre and Camp- \$2,500

Whispering Pines Camp is located in Cypress Hills. This year, the Camp applied for funding to purchase two new mountain bikes for use at their camp in Elkwater. The Community Foundation awarded them a grant of \$2,500 to purchase the bikes.



Avalon Equine- \$6,500

Avalon Equine applied for funding for the 'Building Resiliency in Youth' program with the Prairie Rose School Division to focus on student mental health and build lifelong resiliency skills. The Community Foundation has awarded them a grant of \$6,500 for this program.
