#### **Fund Highlight**

CFSEA is grateful to have received an initial donation of \$75,000 as Pattern Energy establishes its Lanfine Wind Community Benefits Program. Over the years, Lanfine Wind next 19 contribute \$1,000,000 to CFSEA which support local initiatives community-based organizations within Special Area 3, the MD of Acadia, and the Town of Oyen. The Community Benefits Program will begin accepting applications from charitable organizations in 2024. 
#### Vital Signs Event and Publication

The Federal Government's recent changes to the Budget regarding the Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT) has created great concern and will be detrimental for charities and their donors across the country. The Federal Government has proposed an increase to the inclusion rate on donations of publicly traded securities from 0% to 30% as of January 1, 2024.
